
I am writing you in regards to the license renewal and public interest status request for "AVIS DE RECHERCHE" (ADR-TV).

On behalf of my entire family, I truly hope that you will renew the above mentioned license and public interest status. My sister Melanie has been missing 25 years now, and the staff members at AVIS DE RECHERCHE have been extremely supportive of our ongoing search for the whereabouts of Melanie. Our recent media coverage in September of 2012 was a direct follow-up to the documentary that was done on Melanie by ADR in the spring of the same year.

I am aware of no other program of its kind in the province of Quebec, and families of missing children must have an avenue in which they can relay information of their missing family members to the public. Families of missing children like our own cannot channel information to the public by ourselves, and therefore rely on public programming like AVIS DE RECHERCHE.

Again, we urge you to continue support in the ongoing effort of missing children public awareness and prevention that AVIS DE RECHERCHE has been a part of.
